


"Excuse me?! What kind of story is this?! Out of all my 15 years of teaching I have never heard of such a ridiculous lie!" she interrupted.

### **ICT** Department Update

In ICT, Year 7 and 8 pupils have been learning to program. Year 7 are using 'Scratch' and focussing on Assignment, Iteration, and Selection which allows them to control the "flow" of a computer program to help it use data, repeat instructions, and make decisions. 'Scratch' allows pupils to do this in an engaging way. This term their final assessment will be making a dance game using some of the images seen here.



Year 8 are moving on from 'Scratch' to use 'Python'. While using the same programming structures as Year 7, 'Python' allows Year 8 pupils to be introduced to a scripted language where they need to ensure they are being very precise in the instructions they are giving the computer. - Select from the three options Online, Invisible or Busy.




#### Block a user using these simple instructions;

- Tap on Report, select the reason why you are reporting them, provide a decription and tap on **Send**.



## How five-day isolation rule works in England


