They are now developing these by looking at artists such as Jenny Saville and Francoise Nielly to help develop their own expressive styles in ink, paint and oil pastels.










Year 11 Photography students have been showing some outstanding experimentation and creativity in the development of their portfolios.

#### Report a post using these simple instructions:

- Tap on **Report**.
- Select a reason for your report and follow the instructions.
- The user has now been reported.

## Block

#### Block a user using these simple instructions:

- On the users profile tap on in the top right corner.
- Tap on Block User.
- Tap on Block.
- The user is now blocked.

## **Privacy**

#### Configure your privacy settings:

- On your home screen tap on 🛑 in the top right hand side.
- Scroll down and tap on Settings and then your username at
- Scroll down to Blocking and Permissions.
- Here you can configure your chat requests, who follows you and direct message requests
