






Art Department Update






Maths Department Update

Sparx Maths

We are delighted to let you know that from 16th January students will be completing their maths homework using Sparx Maths.





How does Sparx homework work?

Sparx personalises each child's homework, creating a weekly set of questions tailored to their level of understanding and learning pace. The questions are designed to be achievable whilst offering the stretch that learners need to make progress.

Each week, topics are set by your child's maths teacher and will make up the majority of the homework questions. Questions from previous topics will also be included in the homework so that students can keep practising the skills they have learned.


How can I help my child with their homework?

We appreciate that you will of course want to support your child with their home learning but please try not to help them with a question until they've had a go first! It is really important that they complete their homework independently, and that questions are marked as correct. They can watch the support video if they need to. This way, Sparx can make sure your child continues to see homework that's at the right level for them.


Year Group Updates


Year 7 have started algebraic expressions. First by looking at the order of operations (BIDMAS). They have also been busy preparing for and completing their landmark assessments which take place this week and next – we cannot wait to see how much progress they have made.




Year 8 have been looking at probabilities (mutually exclusive events and sample space)

Year 9 have been working on calculating with fractions, including converting between








improper fractions and mixed numbers, and adding and subtracting fractions.

Year 10 have been calculating the volume of prisms.

Year 11 have been working on simultaneous equations.











Nintendo Switch



The Nintendo Switch was launched back in 2017 but continues to be popular. The console was the first 'Hybrid', meaning it was both portable and for home use. The console actually has a built-in screen, making it extremely popular with gamers of all ages.

Parental Controls

Nintendo has designed an App called 'Nintendo Switch Parental Controls', specifically for parents to ensure a safer experience on the Switch. In this App, after making an account, you can take advantage of the following parental control settings:

Here you can find the following features:

- Parents can control how long children and young people are allowed the play the Nintendo Switch. Parents can set time limits and an in-game alarm will let the young gamer know their time is up.
- Monitor what type of games a child or young person is playing via reports.
- · Parents can choose to restrict certain games, based on PEGI Ratings.
- There is a feature to stop children and young people from posting screenshots taken on the Nintendo Switch to social media platforms.
- · Restrict the ability to communicate with other players. This can be done on a game by game basis too.

Users can choose to block another use through the following actions:





3. From this list, identify the user you wish to block and select **block** and then **block** again to confirm.

In order to report a player, you must download the Nintendo Switch Online app on a smart device.

- 1. From your main menu, select your **vault**.
- Select the Records square.
- 3. Select the player you wish to report and press A on your Nintendo Switch.
- 4. Add in your reasoning for making the report and the select **report** to submit.
